ETSSW is state-funded and teaches the National Curriculum. It is open to students of all backgrounds. It is co-educational and has no school uniform. ETSSW works hard to embrace the input of parents, students, staff and the wider community to improve the school in every way possible.

JUNIOR CYCLE

ETSSW provides a broad curriculum of *Core Subjects*, *Option Subjects* and *Short Courses*. Core subjects are Gaeilge, English, Maths, French, History, Geography, Science and PE. Next year we are looking at introducing Spanish, Technology and Woodwork.

DEMOCRACY & DEBATING

We promote democracy at ETSSW – that's why every student gets to vote for the student president and that's why students have two representatives on the Board of Management.

That's also why debating is a big part of school culture. We participate in competitions like the Concern and UCD debating competitions, but we encourage debating much more than that by having a debate club in the school where every student has an opportunity to learn about public speaking and develop critical thinking skills.

At each debate club meeting, we have a training part — this year so far, we've learned about the power of story-telling, how to improve gesticulation and eye contact and how to use elements of style like listing, pausing and anaphora.

Then we debate – so far, we've debated on lots of topics such as whether cats are better than dogs, whether zoos should be closed or whether the EU should have an army.

Soon we will receive training in using microphones and how Model United Nations works. One day we hope to hold a Model United Nations for schools all over the EU. At ETSSW, we believe in taking democracy and debating seriously!



DAILY LIFE AT ETSSW

At lunch you get to choose between the chill-out group or the active group. The chill-out group relax and chat with friends, the active group do sports like basketball, handball, soccer and table-tennis.

We also run a lot of clubs and you can join as many of them as you like – we have a book club where you can relax and read your favourite books; we have a homework club where you can get all your work done and develop your study skills for the future; we have a music club where you can form groups and share your knowledge of all kinds of music; we have a mathematics club where you can learn just how much fun maths can be and we have a media club which makes films such as vox pops and infographics and helps generate content for school newsletters.
